BIONOL CLEARFIELD PIPELINE PROJECT

On October 6, 2008, T. W. Phillips Pipeline Corp. ("T. W. Phillips"), based in western Pennsylvania, filed an application with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") seeking approval to build a new natural gas pipeline in your area in the spring of 2009. This project, called the Bionol Pipeline Project, includes an eight-mile, six-inch, underground coated steel pipeline. The pipeline will extend from a new ethanol production facility being constructed in the Borough of Clearfield to an interconnection with an existing Columbia Gas Transmission Corporation pipeline located approximately eight miles southeast in Boggs Township.
